June, 1912*	<i>Squaw Man</i>
	Shot in Santiago Canyon. (Several versions of this plot shot in Orange County.) Pathe Company. (<i>archives has still photos; same as in book</i>)
1912-13*	<i>Actor William Boyd</i>
	As a teenager, William Boyd drove a delivery truck for Ehlen and Grote of Orange. He appeared in silent films for 20 years before his role as Hopalong Cassidy.
1915*	<i>Documentary</i>
	For Palace of Education at San Francisco's Pan-Pacific Exposition—five public high schools in Orange County. One scene featured the senior class at Orange studiously putting in the front lawn sprinkling system.
1915*	<i>Goose Girl</i>
	Shot at Orange County [Irvine] Park. "...a local beauty from Orange played the goose girl."
September, 1916	<i>No title given</i>
	Shot in Santiago Canyon. Featured Marie Osborne, age 4, of Orange; later added Jennie Fockers, age 5, of Orange. Balboa Company.
1917*	<i>Movie to publicize Orange Day</i>
	Provided publicity for Orange's Orange Industry (previous year's effort moved \$2.3 million worth of Valencias in a single day).
July, 1919*	<i>Smiles</i>
	Business Men's Clubs of Orange sponsored town promotional documentary. Hewes Park and Plaza used as backdrops.
1920*	<i>When Dawn Came</i>
	Shot in San Juan Capistrano. Directed by Colin Campbell of Orange.
1923*	<i>Cause for Divorce</i>
	Shot in Santa Ana. Director by Hugh Dierker of Orange.
1945	<i>Fallen Angel</i>
	"house at 409 N. Shaffer St...was used as a location for the filming of a 1945 movie called <i>Fallen Angel</i> , starring Clair Trevor. Otto Preminger directed the film and rumor has it that Preminger was traveling through Orange one summer day when he was struck by the beauty of the home." -- Orange County Register, October 6, 1988
1976	<i>Gumball Rally (Feature Film)</i>
	Written and directed by Charles Bail. Filmed part of a coast-to-coast illegal auto race through the Orange Plaza. Production involved removing a plate glass window from a northwest corner store and replacing it with "candy glass" for a crash.

1979	<i>Honda Motorcycle (Commercial)</i>
	409 N. Shaffer: "70-year-old Victorian house in Orange makes homey backdrop for Honda film" (30-minute film on Honda motorcycles). Santa Ana Register, August 24, 1979
1987	<i>Monster in the Closet</i>
	Orange Plaza used for scenes in this film. Spoof of horror/monster films written and directed by Bob Dahlin. Starring Claude Akins and Stella Stevens.
1988	<i>The Bridesmaids (Television Movie)</i>
	A "television movie that will air on CBS starring Shelly Hack, Sela Ward, Brook Adams and Stephanie Faracy but also starring was the plaza and Old Towne." The Orange County Register, November, 1988
1992	<i>Samantha (Feature Film)</i>
	Chapman University provided locations for portions of this comedy starring Dermot Mulroney, Martha Plimpton and Hector Elizondo.
July 17-18, 1994	<i>Toyota (Commercial)</i>
	Toyota commercial filmed in the Orange Plaza. Filming by Watermelon Productions.
October 19-26, 1994	<i>America's Most Wanted (Television Series)</i>
	Filmed at Home Federal Bank, Orange Police Department, Meats Avenue and Westchester. Show led to the capture of fugitive Stephen Moreland Redd, who was wanted by Orange, La Habra, Brea, and Yorba Linda for robbery and murder.
November 10, 1994	<i>Crimson Tide (Feature Film)</i>
	Filmed at Chapman University, 333 North Glassell Street, in front of Memorial Hall. Starred Gene Hackman, Denzel Washington, Viggo Mortenson, George Dzundza and Matt Craven. Directed by Tony Scott.
February 2, 1995	<i>Midas Muffler (Commercial)</i>
	O Pictures Inc. filmed a hidden camera segment for Midas Muffler Shop at 1922 East Chapman Avenue.
March 20, 1995	<i>A Letter to My Killer (Television Movie)</i>
	USA Television used Orange Plaza area to film scenes for this television movie featuring Rip Torn, Nick Chinlund and Mare Winningham. Los Angeles Times, March 20, 1995
March 20, 1995	<i>The Minutes (USA Cable Television - Movie)</i>
	Old Towne Orange is used to capture the fall hunting season of a small town in Lyman, Wisconsin. Filming by Red Envelope Productions.
March 28, 1995	<i>Cox Cable (Commercial)</i>
	Shot on private property at 205 East Palmyra Avenue, Lyon Studios filmed a commercial of Cox Cable buying out Dimension Cable.

October 26, 1995	<i>Gentleman's Club (Feature Film)</i>
	Exterior dialogue with pictures cars. Movie filmed on private property at 426-A W. Almond Avenue. Filming by Pangaea Productions.
Nov.-Dec., 1995	<i>That Thing You Do (Feature Film)</i>
	Tom Hanks-directed movie set in 1960's Pennsylvania. Cast: Tom Everett Scott, Liv Tyler, Johnathan Schaech, Steve Zahn, Ethan Embry, and Tom Hanks. Orange Plaza area used for some locations shots: 10, 75 and 77 Plaza Square; 101, 111, 112, 116, 117, 120 and 131 E. Chapman Avenue; and 102, 106, 108, 109, 114, 115, 117, 121½, 122, 123, 128, 129, 131, 138, 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 146, 148, 148A, 149, 150, 151, 152, 154, 155, 160, 161, 162, 165, 172, 173 and 177 N. 	Interior/Exterior film shoot on private property at 708 East Almond Avenue. Production by Lyon Studios.
January 17, 1996	<i>Albertson's (Commercial)</i>
	Interior film shoot on private property at 8440 East Chapman Avenue. IPS/ Anacapa Productions.
May 5 & 6, 1996	<i>Super Stop & Shop Grocery (Commercial)</i>
	Filming at Rod's Liquor, The Java Station, Satellite Market and Well's Fargo Bank.
May 12, 1996	<i>J C Penney (Commercial)</i>
	J C Penney film showing two children and two adults walking in the dirt near the Santa Fe railroad tracks at Trenton Avenue and Glassell Street. Additional filming shot at Chapman University.
July 29, 1996	<i>Snapple (Commercial)</i>
	Filmed in the 100 block of South Glassell Street, Democrats and Republicans on opposite sides of the street are arguing, in pulls a Snapple truck and brings happiness to both sides. Shot by Propaganda Films.
October 30, 1996	<i>Albertson's (Commercial)</i>
	Interior film shoot on private property at 8440 East Chapman Avenue. George Kline Production Company.
July-August, 1996	<i>Mars (Feature Film)</i>
	A law enforcement officer from Earth travels to Mars to investigate the circumstances behind his brother's death. Mahogany Pictures Inc. shot filming on private property at The City Shopping Center.

	Mazda promotional video. Two Mazda vehicles parked in the driveway with models. Filming took place on private property at 6811 La Cumbre Drive. Produced by KZ Associates, Incorporated.

	Music video of Christian songs taped inside Son Light Christian Church. Production by Psalty's Kids Ministries International.

	Old Towne Plaza area used as the background scene in a commercial featuring the new 1997 Buick.
December 5-6, 1996	<i>Tide (Commercial)</i>
	Interior shot featuring Tide detergent. Filming at Albertson's Market located at 8440 East Chapman Avenue by Moxie Pictures.
Dec. 10-11, 1996	<i>Albertson's (Commercial)</i>
	Interior dialogue at Albertson's Market located at 8440 East Chapman Avenue. Production by Crash Films.
February, 1997	<i>Vital Signs (Television Series)</i>
	Filmed at 525 South Glassell Street and 339 East Palmyra Avenue. Gentleman having a heart attack is placed onto a gurney and transported to an awaiting ambulance. Narrated by Robert Urich, the series features re-enactments of stories of people who survived life-threatening medical events.
February 4 & 5, 1997	<i>The George Wallace Story (Television Movie)</i>
	Re-enactment of a political rally with 500 spectators, George Wallace is shot and taken away in an ambulance. Filmed at the Orange Civic Center by Wallace Production/Turner. Starring Gary Sinise as George Wallace.
February 6, 1997	<i>Hyundai (Commercial)</i>
	Filmed on private property at 708 East Almond Avenue, family members talk about their new Hyundai vehicle parked in their backyard driveway. A Lyon Studio production.
Feb.-Mar., 1997	<i>Joe Angel (Feature Film)</i>
	Freshman Production Services. Interior filming at Orange County ARC warehouse at 1449 W. Grove Avenue. Film is about an angel helping a man to accept his death.
Mar.-Apr., 1997	<i>Present Time (Television Series)</i>
	Interior and exterior filming on private property at St. John's Lutheran Church located at 154 South Shaffer Street and United Pentecostal Church at 527 East Palm Street. Children's television series by John Schmidt Production.
April 3, 1997	<i>Citizen's Communication (Commercial)</i>
	Exterior walk and talk of people handing out towels and placing coins into parking meters. Locations used for filming: Omega Burger at 309 West Chapman Avenue, and the southwest corner of the Plaza in front Deidrich's Coffee House, and North Glassell Street between the Plaza and Maple Avenue.

	Videotaping of motorcycles at 607 West Katella Avenue. Motorcycle rally on private property at dealership parking lot. Commercial to be shown in Canada and Britain. Produced by Talk In Pictures.
September 7, 1997	Microsoft (Commercial)
	Interior dialogue on private property at 708 East Almond Avenue. Produced by Lyon Studios.
September 8-9, 1997	Albertson's (Commercial)
	Exterior driving shots on White Oak Ridge between Newport Boulevard and Canyon View. Interior and exterior dialogue at Albertson's Market at 8440 East Chapman Avenue.
November 7, 1997	Casita Home For Children (Public Service Announcement)
	Public Service Announcement at a home for abused children at 1091 N. California Street. Interior shots of children's home and kids playing in backyard. Heil -Brice Production Company.
November 8,9,15,16 & 23, 1997	Santa Claus (MTV Music Video - Koton Mouth Kings)
	Filmed on private property at 696 N. Fern Street. Santa takes on a new look and gets arrested. Time Warner Production.
November 9, 1997	Suburban Life (MTV Music Video - Koton Mouth Kings)
	Block party music performance with outdoor stage built in local resident cul-de-sac near 1400 Navarro Place. Orange County Group platinum hits: "Dog's Life" and "Bump" (on Scream 2 soundtrack).
February 2, 1998	Amica Insurance (Commercial)
	Filming by Flying Tiger Films. Interior and exterior dialogue with rain and wind machines at Swift & Swift located at 10 Plaza Square and Hank's Barbershop at 30 Plaza Square.

February 12, 1998	<i>Media One (Commercial)</i>
	Filmed by Circle Production, commercial features a Media One van being driven on the 200 Block of North Grand Street and on Monterey Road between Maple and Chapman Avenues. Also shown in the commercial is a marching band marching around and through the Old Towne Plaza.
February 17, 1998	<i>Yamaha (Commercial)</i>
	Filming of two children on bicycles admiring two motorcycles, one from the 1950's and the other from 1989. Local streets used for filming include Everett Place, Lomita Avenue and Oakmont Avenue.

March 18, 1998	<i>Oscar Mayer (Commercial)</i>
	Driving scenes of the Oscar Mayer Wienermobile being driven around the Orange Plaza area and at the southwest corner of La Veta Avenue/Flower Street. Filming by Epoch Films, Inc.
March 25 & 26, 1998	<i>Newton Work Shop (Video)</i>
	John Schmidt Production. Film sites included: 414 N. Shaffer Street, 535 S. Orange Street, Eisenhower Park, Storm drain at the corner of Washington and Orange, Bike Trail along the Santa Ana River between Ball Road and Lincoln Avenue, riverbed between Lincoln and Taft, and the Santiago Regional Control Channel next to Fletcher Elementary School. Video features a moving vehicle, people talking, and a car pulling over and to speak with children as they are catching frogs.

	Commercial for Eagle One Car Care filmed at St. John's Lutheran School at 154 South Shaffer Street. Racecar pulls up as teenagers are washing a car. Golden Retriever also on film set. A Lyon Studio production.
August 17, 1998	<i>I'll Remember April (Feature Film)</i>
	Feature film takes place in 1942 following the bombing at Pearl Harbor; one short scene filmed on North Center Street between Maple and Chapman Avenues.

November 12, 1998	<i>Clackamas Mall (Commercial)</i>
	Cable commercial featuring two children in front of residential homes located at 205 East Palmyra Avenue and 708 East Almond Avenue. Production by Lyon Studios.
February 3, 1999	<i>Nivia Deodorant (Commercial)</i>
	Car-to-car driving shots on Chapman Avenue between Cambridge and Batavia streets, followed by additional driving shots at 101 East Chapman Avenue and filming of exterior dialogue at Chapman University.
February 24, 1999	<i>National Arbor Day (Public Service Announcement)</i>
	Filming at 205 East Palmyra Avenue and Park Plaza, scenes will show people planting a tree to commemorate the National Arbor Day holiday. The PSA message being that it is beneficial to the environment and to the community to plant trees.
March 2, 1999	<i>Yamaha/"Turn Back Time" (Commercial)</i>
	Shot in a residential area with an old-fashioned ice cream truck parked in the background, this commercial features two Yamaha motorcycles that successfully capture the title of the commercial, "Turn Back Time." Filming takes place at 945 & 1001 East Rose Avenue.
March-April, 1999	<i>Adventures of Rocky and Bullwinkle (Feature Film)</i>
	All filming takes place at Chapman University, 333 North Glassell Street, in front of Memorial Hall with the exception of one interior scene filmed at O'Hara's Pub at 150 North Glassell Street. Feature film starring Robert De Niro as the Evil Fearless Leader, Jason Alexander as Boris Badenov, Rene Russo as Natasha Fatale, and Randy Quaid as Cappy von Trappment.
May 2 & 3, 1999	<i>Sprint PCS (Commercial)</i>
	Filming of a man walking throughout the Orange Plaza District. Some locations used are 131 South Glassell Street, 10 Plaza Square, 116 East Chapman Avenue, and Park Plaza at Chapman Avenue/Glassell Street.
June, 1999	<i>Vanes</i>
	Interior and exterior scenes taken at Casa Murgia's located at 7626B East Chapman Avenue, interior shots taken at Cyranos Coffee House at 7444 East Chapman Avenue, and exterior scenes taken at W. O. Hart Park.

	Filming at The Block At Orange and Eisenhower Park by Bob Well Productions.

	Twentieth Century Fox Production starring Martin Lawrence establishing shots of Plaza Park and filming at 182, 192 and 195 North Shaffer Street; and Rod's Liquor at 118 West Chapman Avenue. Also starring Nia Long, Paul Giamatti, Jascha Washington and Ella Mitchell. Crime-fighting comedy with two undercover agents.
February 17, 2000	<i>Monier Lifetile "Mascot" (Commercial)</i>
	Filming on private property at 708 East Almond Avenue. Man dressed in a tile suit carrying a ladder climbs towards the roof of the house.
April 12, 2000	<i>Giant (Commercial)</i>
	Filming on private property at 238 North Grand Street. Commercial features shopping at Edward's Super Food Stores.
May 10, 2000	<i>The Last Dance (Television Movie)</i>
	Television movie-of-the-week featuring Maureen O'Hara and Eric Stoltz. Exterior filming and driving shots in the southeast, northeast and northwest quadrants of the Plaza. Filming later moves to Rod's Liquor and finishes at the Gillette residence at 205 East Palmyra Avenue. Movie produced by Madison Avenue Production, Inc.
May 11, 2000	<i>Little Company of Mary (Commercial)</i>
	Interior filming on private property at 708 East Almond Avenue.
June 27, 2000	<i>Dodge Neon (Commercial)</i>
	Exterior filming of neon sign at Black's Furniture Store located at 335 West Chapman Avenue.
June 27 & 28, 2000	<i>Shabby Chic (Television Series)</i>
	Taped episode of shopping at various businesses throughout Old Towne Orange. Locations featured: Tony's Architectural Salvage Yard at 123 North Olive Street; Country Roads Antique Mall at 204 West Chapman Avenue; American Roots at 105 West Chapman Avenue; A&P Collectibles at 151 North Glassell Street; Antique Depot at 155 South Glassell Street; Down Home American Country Antiques at 200 East Chapman Avenue; and Plaza Park at Glassell Street/Chapman Avenue.

	Interior dialogue at 238 North Grand Street; exterior dialogue at 235 East Maple Avenue; and exterior walk and talk at Shaffer Street, 100 feet north of Maple Avenue.

Nov. 10, 13 & 14, 2000	<i>Frailty (Feature Film)</i>
	Bill Paxton's directorial debut. Filmed at Orange Plaza; Paul's Auto Repair at 190 South Olive Street; Residence at 191 North Center Street; Residence at 225 East Maple Avenue; Residence at 435 East Palmyra Avenue; Apartment at 240 South Grand Street; Almond Apartments at 304 East Almond Avenue; Covenant Family Fellowship at 305 West Almond Avenue; College Barber Shop at 312 North Glassell Street, and portions of South Glassell Street from the Orange Plaza to Washington Avenue. 	Katie Holmes, Marc Blucas and Michael Keaton star. Forest Whitaker directed. First D Production filmed for three days at various locations in Old Towne Orange including the Orange Plaza. Additional locations include 201 North Glassell (Filling Station interior) and exteriors of various Old Towne locations at 128, 154, 156 & 172 North Glassell. Orange is portrayed as a cottage town.
