FOR PLACEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

Attention All Contractors

DO NOT DEPOSIT CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS ON THE STREET

Effective immediately, placement of construction materials on the street (public or private) is no longer allowed.

Recent NPDES* regulations impose tighter control on depositing construction materials on the street. Violation of NPDES regulations could result in large fines and clean-up costs for the parties involved.

Suggestions:

- Unload construction materials on private properties, such as private driveways.
- Implement appropriate erosion control methods.
- Confine all materials to the deposit area. Do not allow materials to drain onto the street.

Construction Materials:

The term construction materials shall include, but not limited to, sand, rock, brick, roofing material, lumber, etc.

Appeal Process:

Contact the City of Orange Public Works Department, (714) 744-5525, for further guidelines. An erosion control plan and a traffic control plan must be submitted and approved by the Public Works Department before any work is done.

An Encroachment Permit may be issued if all permit requirements are satisfied. Fees related to the Encroachment Permit include (1) Permit Fee of \$50, (2) Inspection Fee of \$50 minimum, and (3) Cleanup Deposit Fee of \$1,000 minimum.

Placement of construction materials on arterial streets is absolutely prohibited.
