

LETTER OF DRAINAGE ASSESSMENT

A Letter of Drainage Assessment may be substituted in lieu of a Drainage Report for any proposed development site that meets the listed qualifying criteria:

- 1. Proposed development is one half (1/2) acre or less in area (Larger sites may be approved on a case-by-case basis).
- 2. Doesn't directly drain to the City's inlets or storm drain pipes.
- 3. No off-site surface drainage passes through the site.
- 4. Doesn't alter the existing drainage pattern.
- 5. The site is adjacent to an improved drainage channel maintained by a municipal agency or a paved street having concrete curb and gutter.
- 6. The adjacent surface drainage system will hydraulically accommodate post-development runoff within the Orange County Local Drainage Manual criteria.
- 7. There are no site-specific drainage limitations such as maximum stormwater release rate.

The letter shall be 8-½"x11" sheets on the submitting engineer's letterhead and shall include the following information in narrative form:

- 1. Total area of the site and square footage of pre/post development pervious and impervious areas.
- 2. A brief description of the location including tract and lot number along with adjacent streets.
- 3. A brief description of the proposed development.
- 4. Design storm frequency and flow rate (cfs) of the adjacent facility (hydraulic capacity).
- 5. Pad elevation design (needs to comply with Orange County Local Drainage Manual requirements).
- 6. Pre/post development flows (cfs) as calculated per Orange County Hydrology Manual for the storm frequency as noted in item 4, and the post construction total flow in the adjacent facility.
- 7. Disposition of the discharge point to adjacent facility (if applicable).
- 8. An evaluation of the overflow path during a 100-year storm event confirming that the building pad is protected in such events, even if the onsite inlets are completely plugged.
- 9. A brief discussion of the structural post-construction BMPs implemented on the site.

The letter shall be signed, dated and stamped by a California Registered Civil Engineer. After City review and approval, the "Letter of Drainage Assessment" will be accepted in lieu of the drainage report.
