DUMP RIGHT SO OC STAYS BRIGHT

Use your favorite search engine to find the nearest dump station.

If black- or gray-water is not disposed of properly, it can pollute our creeks, rivers, and ocean. You can keep sewage, bacteria, and other pollutants out of Orange County waterways by using RV dump stations.

Here are some tips to ensure you have a safe and efficient experience at any RV dump station.

1. Before opening the tank valve, secure both ends of the RV sewer hose.
2. Dump your black-water tank first.
3. Dump your gray-water tank second to clean residue from the hose.
4. Stuff happens. So keep a spill response kit handy. Make sure that cleaning materials, like antibacterial wipes and absorbents, are always ready to apply and sweep up.
