PARK RULES



As a general rule, City parks shall be open to the general public between the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Below is a summary of Park Regulations taken from section 12.48 of the Orange Municipal Code, for a complete list visit www.cityoforange.org. City parks may be closed at any time due to inclement weather and other unforeseen safety circumstances without notice.

- Groups of 25 or more gathering in City parks are required to have a permit
- Sport groups and/or organized sporting activities with 10 or more people are required to have a field permit
- Permits are required for jumpers/bounce houses
- The following activities require special consideration and therefore require a permit:
 - > Events utilizing amplified sound equipment
 - Musical performances and/or concerts
 - Races, marathons, contests, and/or tournaments
 - Public displays of art
 - Amusement services and attractions such as, but not limited to fairs, circuses, carnival rides and booths, animal displays and demonstrations, laser tag activities, mazes, etc.
 - Wedding ceremonies
- Permit holders have priority to reservable areas in City parks
- No person shall be in City parks and/or no vehicles may be parked in City parking lots between the hours of 11:00 p.m. 5:00 a.m.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed in City parks
- Unauthorized vehicles may not drive onto any City park
- No person shall camp or erect tents in City parks
- No person shall make or kindle a fire in any City park (designated park barbeque devices for cooking excluded)
- Fireworks, firecrackers, and other pyrotechnics are not allowed in City parks
- Dogs are required to remain on a leash no longer than 6 feet at all times while in a City Park and dog owners are required to clean up after their dogs. (Yorba Dog Park has exceptions to the leash rule)
- Propelled and/or motorized objects are not allowed in City parks
- Selling, soliciting, and/or advertising in a City park are not allowed
- Free distribution of food, beverages, and/or supplies to the general public is not allowed in City parks
- Walkways must remain unobstructed at all times
- The City follows California Department of Health smoking restrictions which prohibit smoking at all
- park buildings including entrances, at or near playgrounds, and at or near active sports fields
