HOW CAN A STREET BE DESIGNATED PARKING-BY-PERMIT ONLY?

SUBMIT WRITTEN REQUEST

- From a property owner on affected and eligible street
- \$1000 application fee
- Identify proposed boundaries

SATISFY CRITERIA

- Benefits significantly outweigh impacts as determined by City staff
- 75% street parking regularly used
- 75% owner support via petition process

APPROVALS

- City Traffic Commission
- City Council

WHERE CAN I FIND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE NPPP?

Section 10.30 of the Orange Municipal Code contains all the details of the neighborhood permit parking program, including streamlined approval processes for streets meeting certain criteria, implementation procedures, and exceptions.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

ARE THERE LIMITATIONS AND DRAWBACKS TO PERMIT PARKING?

While permit parking can be an appropriate tool in certain situations, it cannot address parking demand that is “internal” to a street.

There can also be side effects and unintended consequences. Among other things, it can displace parking demand into other areas, as well as inconvenience residents of permitted streets and their guests.

In addition, residents of permitted streets must pay to obtain parking permits and properly display them at all times to avoid citation.

Visitors and service providers are also subject to citation.

MY STREET ALREADY HAS PERMIT PARKING. HOW DO I OBTAIN PERMITS?

For \$30 per household (subject to renewal), permits can be ordered online through Data Ticket at:

www.cityoforange.org/parkingpermits

The number of permits allowed is based on the number of bedrooms in your dwelling or 5, whichever is less.

Temporary permits for special events may be obtained up to 4 times per year (restrictions apply.)
